

## Panelist Bios - Young Alumni Tips and Tricks for Success

Melissa Allen '17, '19M (she/her) graduated in 2017 with a Bachelor of Arts in Spanish and a Bachelor of Music in vocal performance, the latter of which she completed her Honors capstone titled "'Ain't it a pretty night?': An analysis of Carlisle Floyd's Susannah as an allegory for the socio-political culture of the United States in the 1950s." Melissa remained at JMU to complete her Master of Education in College Student Personnel Administration (M.Ed. '19) and worked in the Office of Student Accountability and Restorative Practices full time before leaving to pursue her doctorate at William & Mary in Fall 2020. As a Ph.D. student at William & Mary, Melissa studies higher education with a research focus on the role of media in LGBTQ+ emerging adult identity development and the use of media as developmental tools in co-curricular spaces. Her current line of research explores graphic novels as sites of development as well as the developmental implications of trope-laden portrayals of bisexuality. With two years left in her doctoral studies, Melissa ultimately hopes to become faculty at a college or university and continue her work with college students, but this time in the classroom.

Kaitlin Daff '17 (she/her) is currently a fourth-year medical student at VCU School of Medicine. She graduated from JMU in Winter of 2017 with a B.S. in Biology and Minor in Honors Interdisciplinary Studies. In her gap year prior to medical school, she worked as a medical scribe in a family practice, a volunteer EMT, and as a waitress. Her quick tip for young alumni is to really do your research before committing to graduate school - it is worth it to consider everything including salary/benefits, work environment, and whether you really need an advanced degree for the career you want.
